

Cashmere

Cashmere is the downy hair that comes from cashmere goats. Known for its scarcity, only 150g of Cashmere, strictly defined as only the soft downy hair, is hand-manually picked per head using a large comb. The average amount of wool harvested at once is about 4kg, so you can see how scarce Cashmere is. Cashmere has thinner fibers than other animals, so it is supple and soft to the touch. In addition, it contains a lot of air, so it is fluffy and light and prevents warmth from escaping.
